**Note:**

1. GE stands for General elective or generic elective. Generic electives are a pool of courses meant to provide inter disciplinary education to students. Every student has to opt one paper from this pool except the paper offered by her main discipline. For example: if a student is studying B.Com(Hons), she cannot opt for paper offered by commerce department.
2. DSE stands for Discipline specific electives. These papers are offered by department to their own students. Students can choose between DSE of their own department or GE offered by other departments. Some DSEs are also offered by departments to other students in the 4<sup>th</sup> semester which is mentioned in the list.
3. Student will not be permitted to change the option/Preference once submitted under any circumstances.
4. Minimum number of students in a class is 20, some paper offered may not be able to fulfill these criteria and the students may be asked to make another choice.
5. Students should decide their preferences carefully before filling the google form which will be circulated in due Course because they may not get there first preference due to paucity of Seats.
