Brief Paper Introduction:

Paper: E-Commerce

Taught by: Rahul Chopal, Department of Commerce

The main objective of this paper is to clearly understand the concept of e-commerce and its scope. E-Commerce means commercial transactions conducted electronically on the internet. This paper is divided into five units which are- Introduction to e-commerce; Planning online business; Technology for online business; Operations of e-commerce; and Security and legal aspects of e-commerce.

Paper: Introducing Indian Art (paper-2)

Paper: Creative writing

It's an application based course wherein the students are encouraged to write stories, poems, drama, create advertisements and learn the nuances of journalistic writing. The paper broadly focuses on 4 areas: art and craft of writing, modes of creative writing, writing for the media and preparing for publication.

Paper Name: Public Opinion and Survey Research

Taught by: Dr. Anju Singh, Department of Political Science

The objective of this course to introduce the students to the debates, principles and practices of public opinion polling with special reference to democracies, particularly in the India context. This paper will help students conceptualize and measure public opinion using quantitative methods. The students would learn basic skills pertaining to the collection, analysis and utilisation of quantitative data.

Paper Name: Remote Sensing and GPS based project report

Taught By: Homolata Borah

The course structure undertakes to understand the changing morphology of the physical, cultural, economic, environmental changes on the surface of the earth through processes of interpreting satellite imageries and aerial photographs.

The nature of course is gradual which initially creates theoretical background and then proceeds to application of those learnings using both aerial and satellite images.

The usability can be utilised to understand the changing nature of the earth surface.

Paper Name: Gender Sensitization

Taught by: Dr. Urna Sarkar Dutta, Department of Sociology

This course will sensitise students to issues related to gender and equality among all sexes. It will help the students to develop sensitivity towards women issues and problem and try to look them from multicultural practices. It will provide them with the tools and skills to develop and integrate a gendered perspective in work and life. In particular, students will be acquainted with laws that have an immediate bearing on gender relations.

This course is designed to help students appreciate, learn and practice data based research skill that will help them in writing term paper project report etc. in their discipline and general elective courses.

Paper: Managing Human Resources
