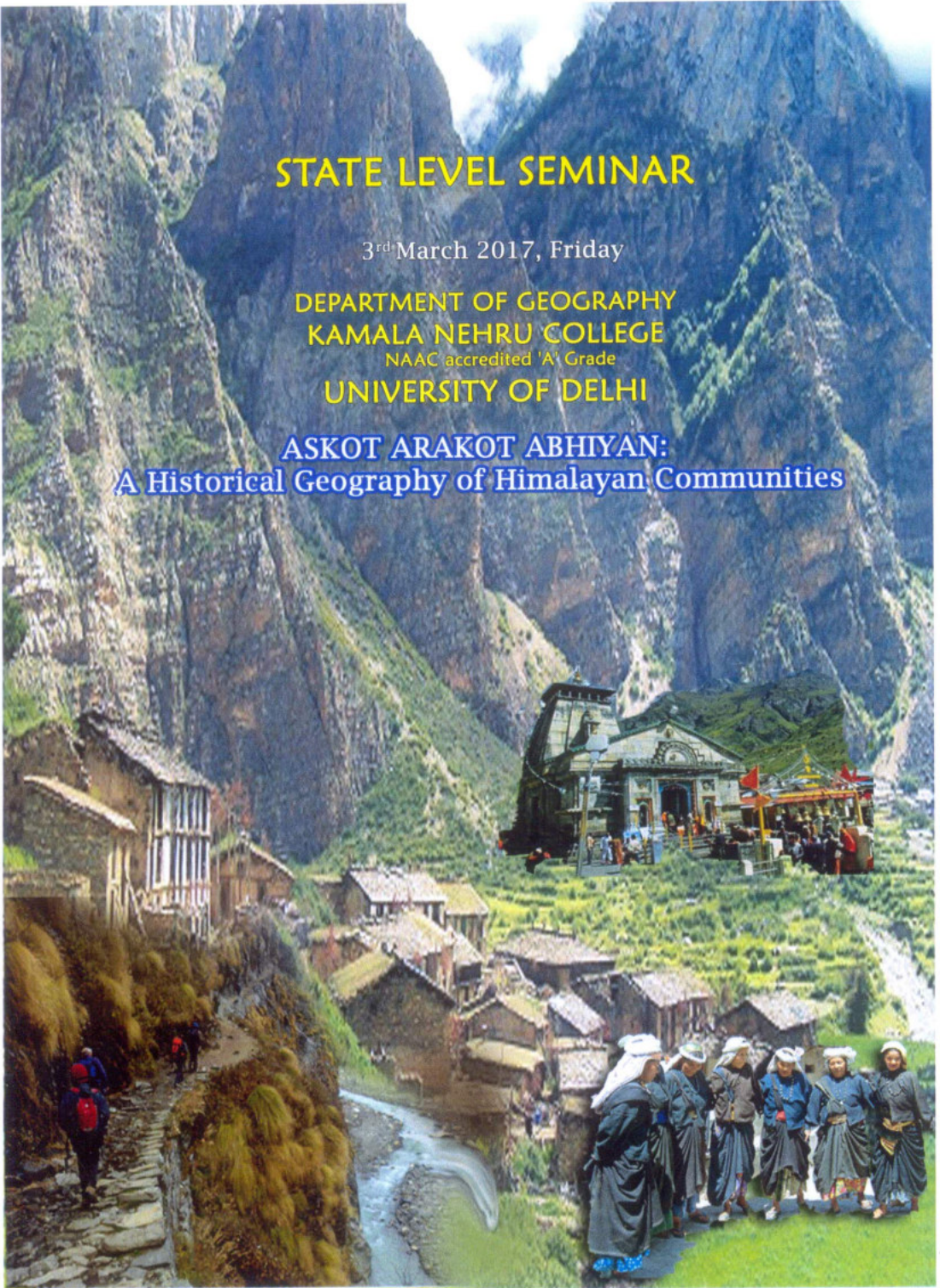

ASKOT ARAKOT ABHIYAN:
A Historical Geography of Himalayan Communities



ABOUT THE SEMINAR

The Himalayas form a unique geographical region with its rich landscape of mountain ranges, river valleys, lakes, forests and meadows. It is also an abode of hill communities who hold a close relationship with their immediate environment but are also increasingly being affected by external pressures. The fragility of ecosystems in Himalayas and their transformative nature has always attracted scientists and social scientists alike including geographers and historians.

The department of geography of Kamala Nehru College is inviting Prof. Shekhar Pathak, a noted historian who has studied hill communities in Utrakhand over a period of five decades. His research organisation is named People's Association for Himalayan Area Research (PAHAR). It is a non-profit organization dedicated to raising awareness of the fragile Himalayan environment and bringing together scientists, social activists, and common people to save the Himalayas. PAHAR has been organizing a trek from Askot (Pithoragarh) to Arakot (Uttarkashi) at a select interval of 10 years. Five such research expeditions have been undertaken between 1974 and 2104 with the participants including scientists, activists, environmentalists, litterateurs, journalist, artists, mountaineers and all those committed to a scientific understanding of Himalayan society, culture, history and environment.

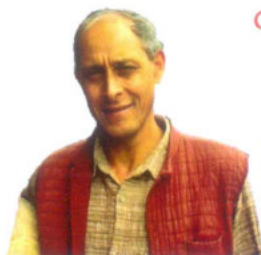
In this academic meet, Prof. Pathak, along with his team, will present the outcome of his research expeditions. This is supposed to give the participants a historical perspective of changing human geography of the study area. The knowledge about human communities in this ecologically and culturally important region and the transitional challenges they are facing will be of interest to participants across disciplines. Since this discourse touches upon the various social, economic, and ecological aspects of the places and people in Himalayas, it has an equal appeal for students and scholars working in areas of environment and development besides that of disciplines of geography and history.

OUR EMINENT SPEAKER

Prof. Shekhar Pathak taught in Kumaon University for more than three decades. He has worked on different aspects of Himalayan history, social- environmental movements, folk culture and exploration. He has been a fellow at different organisations like Indian Institute of Advanced studies, Shimla, and Center for Contemporary Studies, at Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi. He is a founder of People's Association for Himalaya Area Research (PAHAR). He is also the editor of the Himalayan journal of same name and the Vice President (Asia/Himalaya) of WMPA (World Mountain People Association). Prof. Pathak has written and edited books on Begar System, Freedom Struggle, Forest Movements, Life and Times of Pundit Nain Singh Rawat, Kailash Manasrovar, Languages of Uttarakhand, and Folk Poetry of Kumaon.
