


NSS UNIT OF KAMALA NEHRU COLLEGE

JANUARY 2021



 - 3rd - Vanshika Jolly, B.A (Hons) Psychology, 1st Year





Present: What do you mean?






OCTOBER 2021







- Task: Volunteers asked to hold a placard where they can write a short sentence, slogan or phrase, make a poster on the theme – **Say no to Crackers.**




○ **Day 3: REUSE COMPETITION**




- **Day 4: REFUEL**

- On the occasion of **‘International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women’** NSS KNC held an event to commemorate the day. All volunteers were required to make a palm painting on the theme 'Elimination of Violence against Women'. The paintings submitted were posted on all social media handles with Women empowerment hashtags
- On the occasion of **‘WORLD TOILET DAY’** on 19th November 2021, NSS KNC put forth an event wherein all volunteers were asked to

write a paragraph on their view on 'how to spread knowledge about basic sanitation to layman' in about 200-250 words.


DECEMBER 2021

- **Recruitment of new NSS volunteers :** With the beginning of the new session 2021-22, new opportunities open up in the NSS forum of our college for the newly admitted and second-year students. The NSS team organised a three-layered selection process for the recruitment of volunteers. The first phase included a google form encompassing questions to check the basic understanding, getting an introduction and contributions by the applicants in the social sector at their level. The second phase included an orientation programme for the candidates selected in the first phase. The third phase also included a google form that was based on the orientation to check the candidate's alertness and focusing capabilities. After a week-long process of selecting, our team was welcomed with 75 new volunteers.



- On the occasion of the **National Youth Festival**, NSS volunteers were asked to submit an essay on either '**India of My Dream-Vision @2047**' or '**Unsung Local Heroes of Freedom Movement**'. The language was flexible, volunteers were to write in English or Hindi. The maximum word limit for the essay was 300 words only. Such a task helped volunteers to gain up knowledge regarding local heroes and express their visions for a better India. We had received beautiful responses.
- On the occasion of '**Local and Vocal**' and '**Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav**', volunteers were asked to look for local handicrafts striving in the market since older times to uplift their art in today's

machinery-dominated era. Further, they were asked to trace back the importance or role/use of the handicrafts dating back to the independence period. This task enabled them to look for different handicrafts in their neighbouring markets, in addition, coming across people and owners struggling from earlier times. We received a vibrant range of responses.



- In an initiative of NSS KNC to produce a documentary and research paper on the theme “**Searching for Street Talent on The Street**” volunteers were asked to look for street performers within their locality asking a few questions and creating a video clip out of it to be incorporated in the **documentary and research paper which is set to be produced and published at the earliest.**
