





1. We also participated in other college fests and competitions which are mentioned below. -

- We had an online Farewell conducted for our seniors as well on 31st July 2021.




- We also made it a point to expand our Instagram page through posts and reels which helped in encouraging the members in participating and showcasing their music.

1. We had a brief online session with our seniors who have already graduated but were a part of Zephyr and are now currently pursuing music. It was on 2nd May 2021. The main aim of the meeting was to help the first years in understanding the technical concepts of music better and to get an idea of how acapella actually works.
2. We had co-hosted and participated in an online Open Mic event organized by The Humit, which is a relatively new but promising company focused on music, on 28th August 2021. We had an overwhelming number of participants and audience, and overall it was a success.



3. Some of our members performed for an NGO event of the GirlUp Organization on 4th December 2021 at Champa Gali, Delhi. This event was organized to celebrate the 16-day Activism Against Gender-based Violence in collaboration with the Fair Trade Forum India and in partnership with UNHCR, India.
